# MARION COUNTY QUORUM COURT MINUTES

June 9, 2020

The Marion County Quorum Court held its regular meeting on June 9, 2020.

Justice Shipman gave the invocation and Justice Madden led the pledge.

County Judge John Massey presided over the meeting. All Justices were present.

The minutes of the May meeting were approved, as amended.

All reports were given and passed unanimously.

During the OEM report, Director Brice Smith gave an updated COVID19 report. There have been 418 people tested in Marion County for the virus and we have had two positive cases. One has completely recovered. Justice Madden asked about the equipment for the Swift Water Rescue due to an unfortunate drowning on Crooked Creek. Smith replied that he had talked to the Arkansas Game and Fish about donating a jet powered boat. It was explained that different waterways need different types of boats.

The Planning Commission had their quarterly meeting and are trying to revise the definition of a subdivision. They are also looking into the permitting process. They stated that they would like to have seven member on the commission in order that the county was properly represented.

## Unfinished Business:

Ordinance 2020-24 - Safety Pay Ordinance – Second Reading – Sponsored by Justices Brigham and Vancuren. If passed this ordinance will eliminate the Safety Pay “bonus”. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice Vancuren. Discussion began with the Clerk Dawn Moffet, addressing the court as to why there was so much reluctance from the court to present this ordinance to a committee. She also stated that she thought that it should be presented to the Personnel committee, as the Personnel Policy states that the county has a safety policy by ordinance. She continued to state that she averaged the receipted money into County General for the months of October and November for the years 2016-2019. The average of those monies was \$577,248.39. Justice Mayo replied that having the ordinance read three times allowed interested individuals to contact their Justice of the Peace and/or their elected officials. Judge Massey stated that he wanted to make sure that we succeed as a county, and although getting rid of the Safety Pay wouldn’t help now, it would help in the future. The other alternatives could include laying employees off, or cutting their pay. Justice Brigham stated that that County General still owed the building fund \$100,000 and that the county simply could not afford this expense. Justice Vancuren called the question, ceasing the discussion, and Justice Brigham seconded it. The motion passed. The motion to adopt that was still on the floor was voted on. The motion passed with Justices Mayo, Madden and McCalla voting against the adoption. A motion to suspend the rules, and read the ordinance for the third time was made by Justice Brigham and seconded by Justice Vancuren. The motion passed with Justices Mayo, Madden and McCalla voting against it. A motion to read by title only was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Brigham. The motion passed with Justice Mayo voting against the motion. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice

Scrima. During the discussion portion of this reading, Justice Vancuren stated that they were all in favor for the safety pay and jet motors, but the money wasn't there. Justice Scrima stated that if we paid the safety pay there would have to be layoffs on December 1. The motion to call the question was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Brigham. The motion passed unanimously. The motion to adopt passed with Justice Mayo, Madden and McCalla voting against.

New Business:

Ordinance 2020-29 – Appropriations and Transfers for Various Offices – Sponsored by Justices McCalla and Nickels. This ordinance appropriates \$24,600.00 from the Additional Motor Fuel Tax Fund to cover the cost of Marion County's portion to resurface Hwy. 101. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-30 – Various Offices – Appropriations and Transfers – Sponsored by Justice McCalla and Nickels. This ordinance allows monies to be moved around to take care of a few overdrawn accounts, and allows for the Collector to appropriate some of her Automation Fund money for the purchase of computers. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice Scrima. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-31 – Library Grant – Sponsored by Justice Mayo. This ordinance receipts a check for \$2,000.00 and appropriates the money into the General Supplies line item for the library. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously.

Judge Massey announced that he had appointed Ryan See to the Fair Board. This appointment was ratified unanimously.

Justice Vancuren asked County Attorney Sam Pasting if he contacted the proper people in regard to assigning a special prosecutor to review the 2019 audit. Pasting stated that the elected official must recuse themselves before such an action can be taken. Prosecutor David Ethredge told Pasting that he would not resign without a conflict.

The meeting was adjourned.

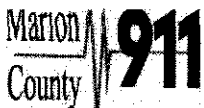

Marion County Budget  
Committee Meeting June 15, 2020

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 pm by Justice Mayo. Justice Scrima started the discussion that he has established a revenue- cash flow chart that matches to Treasurer McPherson's books. Justice Mayo responded that he doesn't see a problem and that the numbers can change daily. Justice Scrima added that problems with the County General account are not new, and the account does not support spending early in the year. Justice Mayo suggested that we not include carryover in the budget. Justice Scrima suggested all special funds be exhausted; saving County General. Clerk Moffet questioned the spending of special funds as they cannot be replenished, and what different departments have used their special funds. Collector Brightwell asked about using her automation account. When asked if you could see a problem with our numbers; Justice Mayo responded that he doesn't have enough information. Judge Massey questioned if none of the committee can see a problem; then we have a problem. When questioned about putting carryover money into a special fund; it would be up to the Judge to monitor it and dispense accordingly. Collector Brightwell offered that 75% of the taxes are paid in October. It was added that the bulk of the Collector's funds come from the settlement. Justice Brigham questioned how each department cut the 10% and did they actually do it? Justice Scrima asked what options do we have, and the last one to be cutting payroll. Clerk Moffet offered that she goes through the bills and doesn't notice any large dollar expenditures. Most, if not all departments are holding the line. Justice Brigham offered that most counties have cut back working hours as us, and only VanBuren county actually laid people off. Judge Massey explained the work- share program which pays \$2,400. a month or \$600. a week. The Judge added the quarry has been shut down and the trucks aren't running which saves \$1,000. a week in fuel. Administrative Assistant Sandi Holt stated all the counties she has talked to; are spending out of their special funds, even to cover other departments. Justice VanCuren echoed the thoughts of the Collector in regards to spending from her special fund. Gentlemen from the audience questioned why not get the Sheriffs department to cut their budget? Justice Mayo stated that all the 10% cut did was cut some spending. Judge Massey suggested we look at each elected- officials department and readjust the budget. Prosecutor Carter suggested we meet every 2 weeks to monitor the situation. The bill from Communication Associates, for \$3,478.25 was discussed and all the fire departments offered to pay it. Committee Chair and Justice Mayo announced his resignation from the committee. The meeting ended at 7:20 pm.
