

# MARION COUNTY QUORUM COURT MINUTES

The Marion County Quorum Court held its regular meeting on October 8, 2019 at 6 p.m.

County Judge John Massey presided. All Justices with the exception of Justice Scrima were present.

Justice Shipman offered the invocation and Justice White led the pledge.

The Marion County 4-H gave their annual presentation. Council President Caleb Rozeboom presented a slide show outlining the projects that the Marion County clubs have been working during the last year. After the reports were read, the Court took a short break to enjoy some treats that the Clubs brought to the meeting.

The regular meeting minutes were approved as corrected. All reports and committee reports were received and passed unanimously.

All reports were read and approved.

Old Business: Justice Brigham asked County Attorney, Sam Pasting, if there were any options to retrieve the \$30,000 spent by former County Judge, Terry Ott. Sam stated that according to statute 14-14-1202, legal fees may be paid out of county funds. There are no options left.

New Business:

Ordinance 2019-65 – Clerk’s Office – Renumbering Ordinance – Sponsored by Justice Mayo. This ordinance corrects an error made in numbering the ordinances in September. Ordinance 2019-58 from September will now be renumbered to read 2019-58-A. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion passed unanimously with the absence of Justice Scrima.

Ordinance 2019-66 - Various Offices – Adjustments – Sponsored by Justice Mayo. This ordinance created line items that were in the budget detail, but not in the recorded budget. Also, a transfer was made to be able to pay the FICA for the Equalization Board. A transfer was also made in the Grant Writers budget to fix the overtime line item overage. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously with the absence of Justice Scrima.

Ordinance 2019-67 – Road Department – Transfers – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This ordinance creates line items for lease purchase principal and lease purchase interest, and moves the monies from note principal and note interest. This is for the 2018 Kenworth Dump Truck. Justice Madden made the motion to adopt and Justice Nickels seconded. The motion passed unanimously with the absence of Justice Scrima.

Ordinance 2019-68 – Sheriff’s Office – Redistribution – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This ordinance moved money from Personal Services into other groups in the Jail Maintenance Special Tax Fund. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice McCalla. During the discussion, Justice Vancuren made a motion to refer the ordinance back to

the budget committee. It was seconded by Justice White. During further discussion, Dawn Flippin, administrative assistant to Sheriff Clinton Evans, stated that without these transfer these bills would not be paid. She also pointed out that these monies would get them to the end of the year. It was explained that if the money did not have to come out of the Personal Services group, these monies could have simply been moved with a court order or a line item transfer. Justice VanCuren offered to pull his motion, but since it was already on the floor it needed to be voted on. The motion to refer this ordinance back to the budget committee failed with Justice Scrima absent, Justices Nickels and Brigham voting in favor of it, and the rest of the Justices voting against it. The motion to adopt passed with Justice Scrima being absent, and Justice Brigham voting against it.

Ordinance 2019-69 – Sheriff’s Office – Appropriation – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This ordinance raises anticipated revenue in Law Enforcement Sales tax and appropriates \$4052.94 into the Parts and Repairs Supplies line item. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice Mayo. The motion passed unanimously with Justice Scrima being absent.


Ordinance 2019-70 – Sheriff’s Office – Drug Enforcement Fund – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This ordinance creates a Drug Enforcement Fund. The money will be maintained in the Treasurer’s Office and cash on hand will be maintained by the Narcotics Officer assigned to the job. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice McCalla. During discussion, the question was asked, where this money came from. Dawn Flippin stated that it is funded only by restitution ordered by the court. The motion passed unanimously with Justice Scrima being absent.

Ordinance 2019-71 – Road Department – Appropriation – Sponsored by Justices Brigham, Mayo and McCalla. This ordinance allows for the appropriation from unappropriated monies in the County Road fund in Machinery and Equipment. \$93000.00 will be allotted for the purchase of a backhoe. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice Mayo. The motion passed unanimously with Justice Scrima being absent.

Ordinance 2019-72 – Capital Mercury Fund – Sponsored by Justice Mayo, McCalla and Brigham. This ordinance will close county fund 3400 Capital Mercury Company (Mar Bax) and move the money into the County Building Improvement Fund. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously with Justice Scrima being absent.

The Yellville Metro Interlocal Agreement was presented to the Justices on the Court.

The meeting was adjourned.
